The A-State Factbook is a publication produced by the Office of Institutional Research that outlines enrollment, faculty and staff data, and other comprehensive information for the Arkansas State University campus at Jonesboro. The A-State Factbook is produced annually and is intended to provide answers to questions that are frequently asked by the administration, faculty, staff, students, alumni and other university constituents.

The definitions and guidelines used to compile this information are provided by the Integrated Postsecondary Education Data System (IPEDS), the Arkansas Department of Higher Education (ADHE), the Office for Civil Rights (OCR) and the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA). It is important to note that the information in this factbook may differ from data reported by the Office of Institutional Effectiveness to federal, state and regional agencies due to differences in reporting guidelines, reporting definitions, and the timing of when the information was prepared.

CARNEGIE CLASSIFICATION

The Carnegie Commission developed a classification of colleges and universities to support its program of research and policy analysis. They are organized around three fundamental questions: what is taught (*Undergraduate & Graduate Instructional Programs*), who are the students (*Enrollment Profile & Undergraduate Profile*), and what is the setting (*Size & Setting*).

A-State's Classifications by Category*

Basic: (Doctoral Universities: R2, High research activity) Institutions that awarded at least 20 research/scholarship doctoral degrees during the update year and also institutions with below 20 research/scholarship doctoral degrees that awarded at least 30 professional practice doctoral degrees in at least 2 programs.

Size & Setting: (M4/R - Medium four-year, primarily residential) *Fall FTE enrollment of 3,000 - 9,999 degree seeking students at these bachelor's or higher degree granting institutions. 25-49 percent of degree-seeking undergraduates live on campus and at least 50 percent attend full time.*

Enrollment Profile: (HU - High undergraduate) *Fall enrollment data show both undergraduate and graduate/professional students, with the graduate enrollment accounting for less than 10-24% of FTE enrollment.*

Undergraduate Profile: (FT4/I - Four-year, medium full-time, selective, lower transfer-in) *Fall enrollment data show at least 60-79% of undergraduates enrolled full-time at these bachelor's or higher degree granting institutions. Test score data for first-year students indicate that these institutions are selective or more selective in admissions. Fewer than 20 percent of entering undergraduates are transfer students.*

Undergraduate Instructional Program: (Prof+A&S/SGC - Professions plus arts & sciences, some graduate coexistence) *60-79% of bachelor's degree majors were in professional fields, and graduate degrees were observed in up to half of the fields corresponding to undergraduate majors.*

Graduate Instructional Program: (Research Doctoral: Professional-dominant) *These institutions award research doctoral degrees in a range of fields, and the largest number of research doctorates were in professions other than engineering (such as education, health professions, law, public policy, or social work).*

**NOTE: Jonesboro's faculty includes instructional and research faculty.



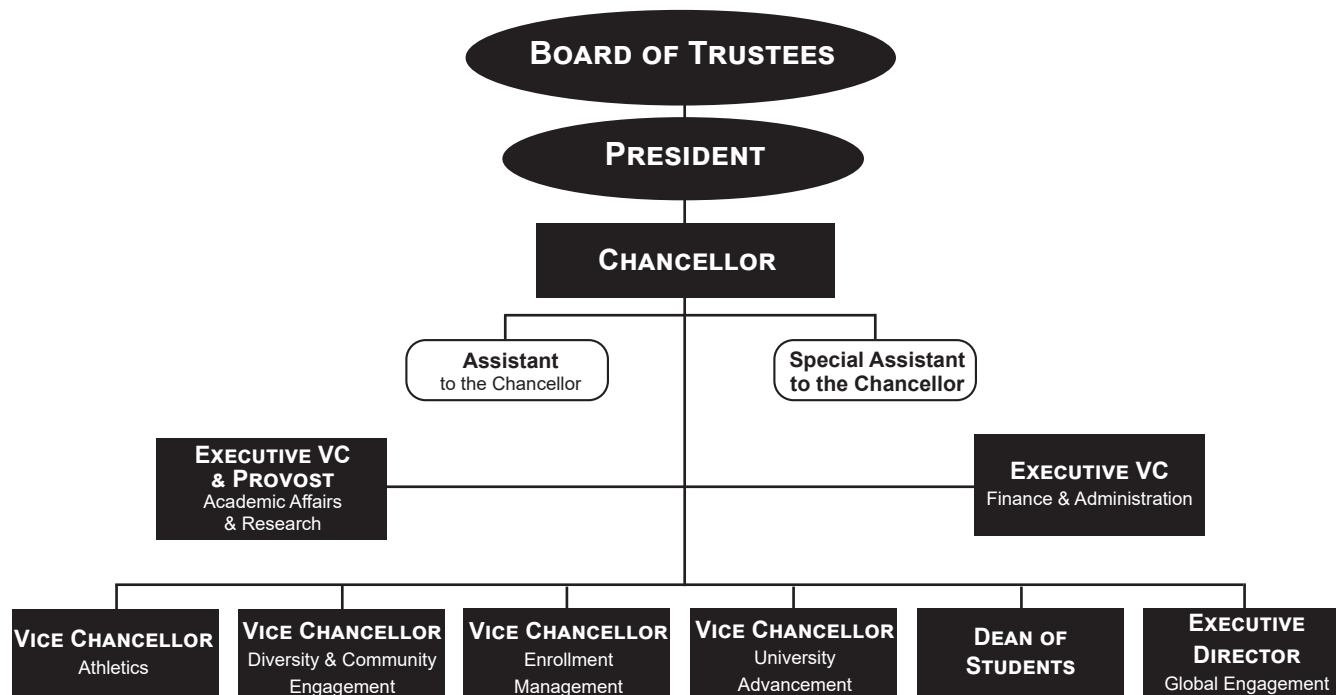

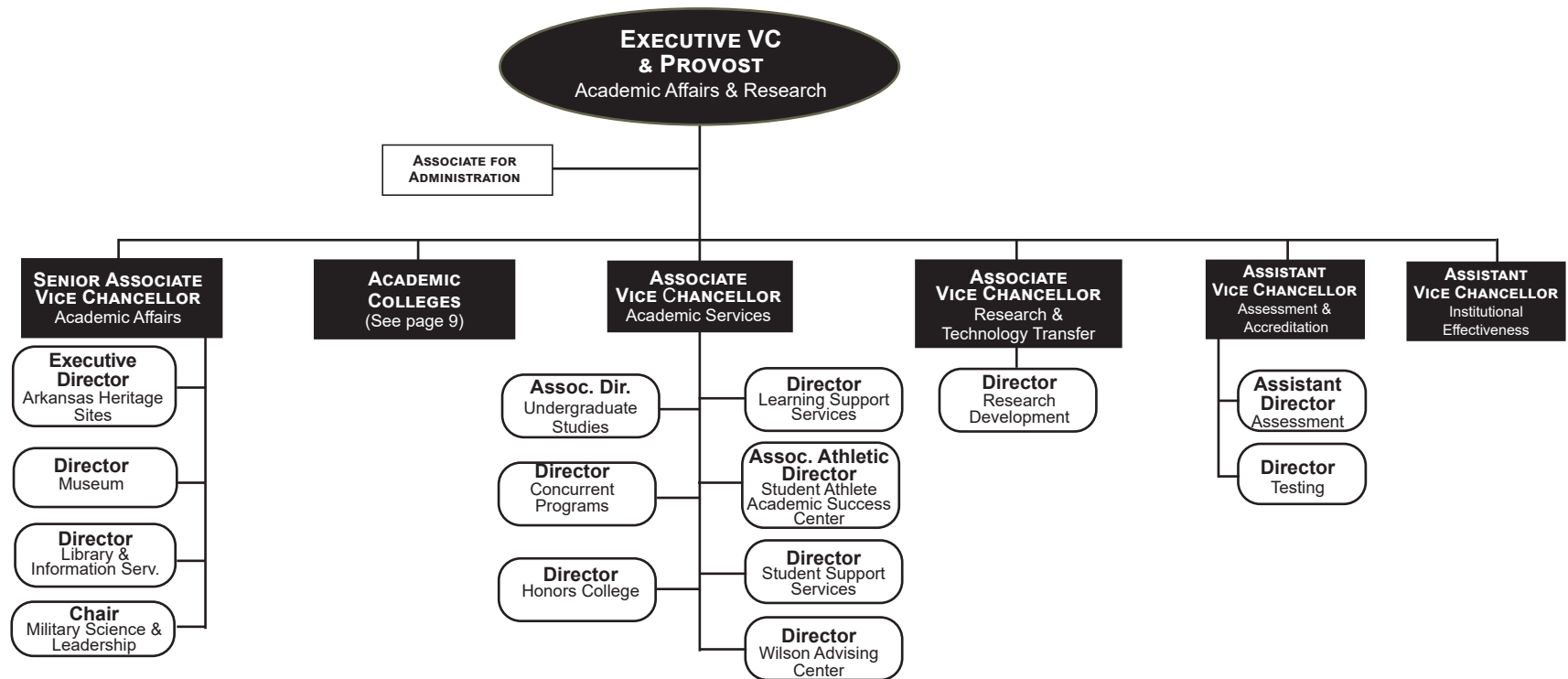
2019-2020 Organizational Structure



Academic Affairs & Research, A-State

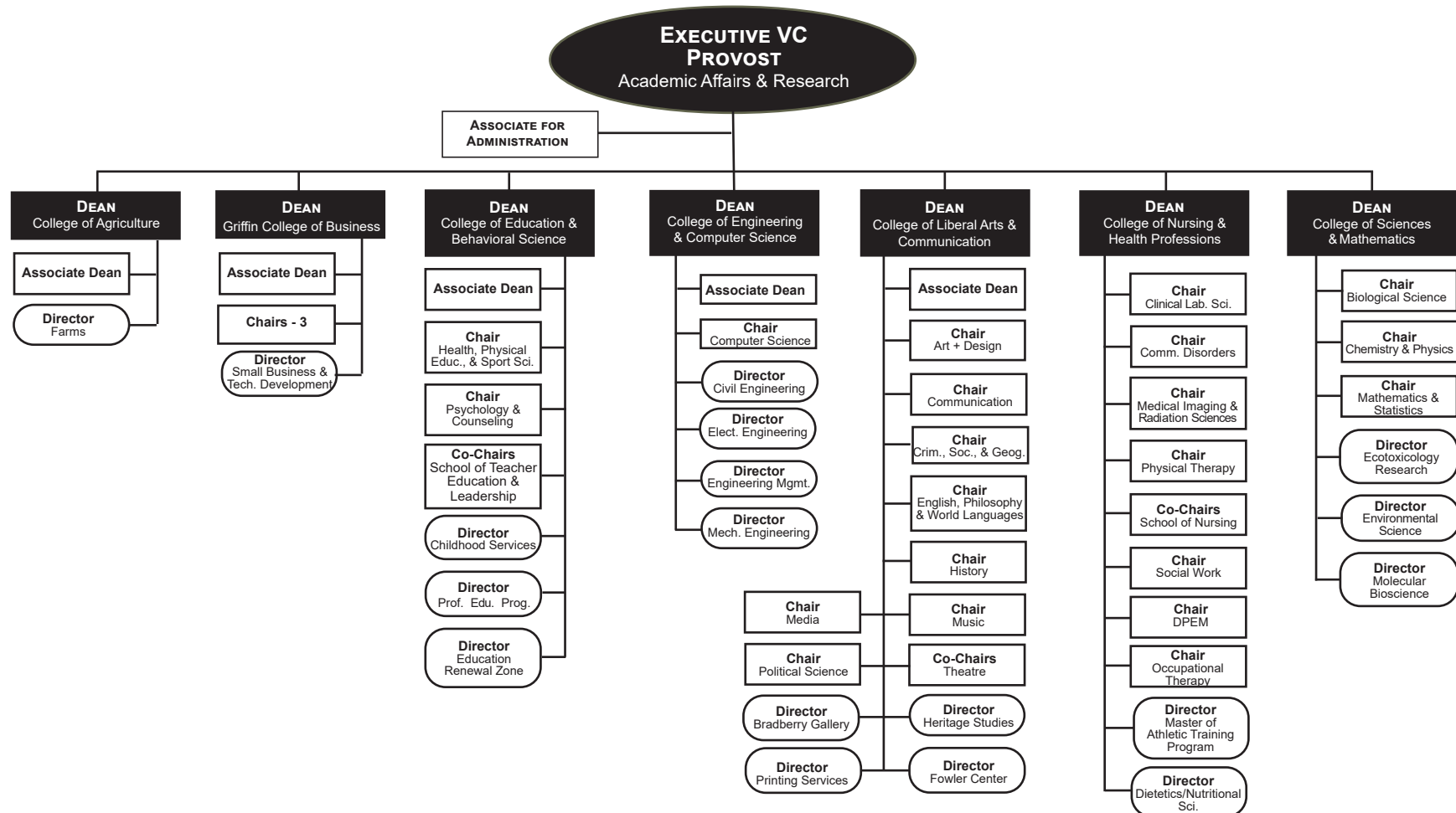


2019-2020 Organizational Structure



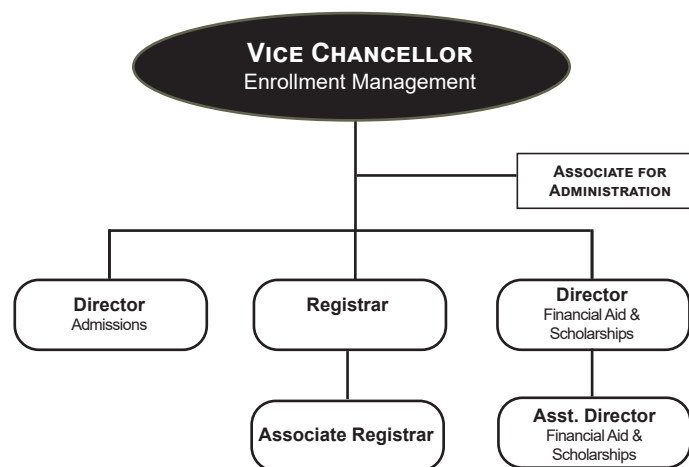

2019-2020 Organizational Structure



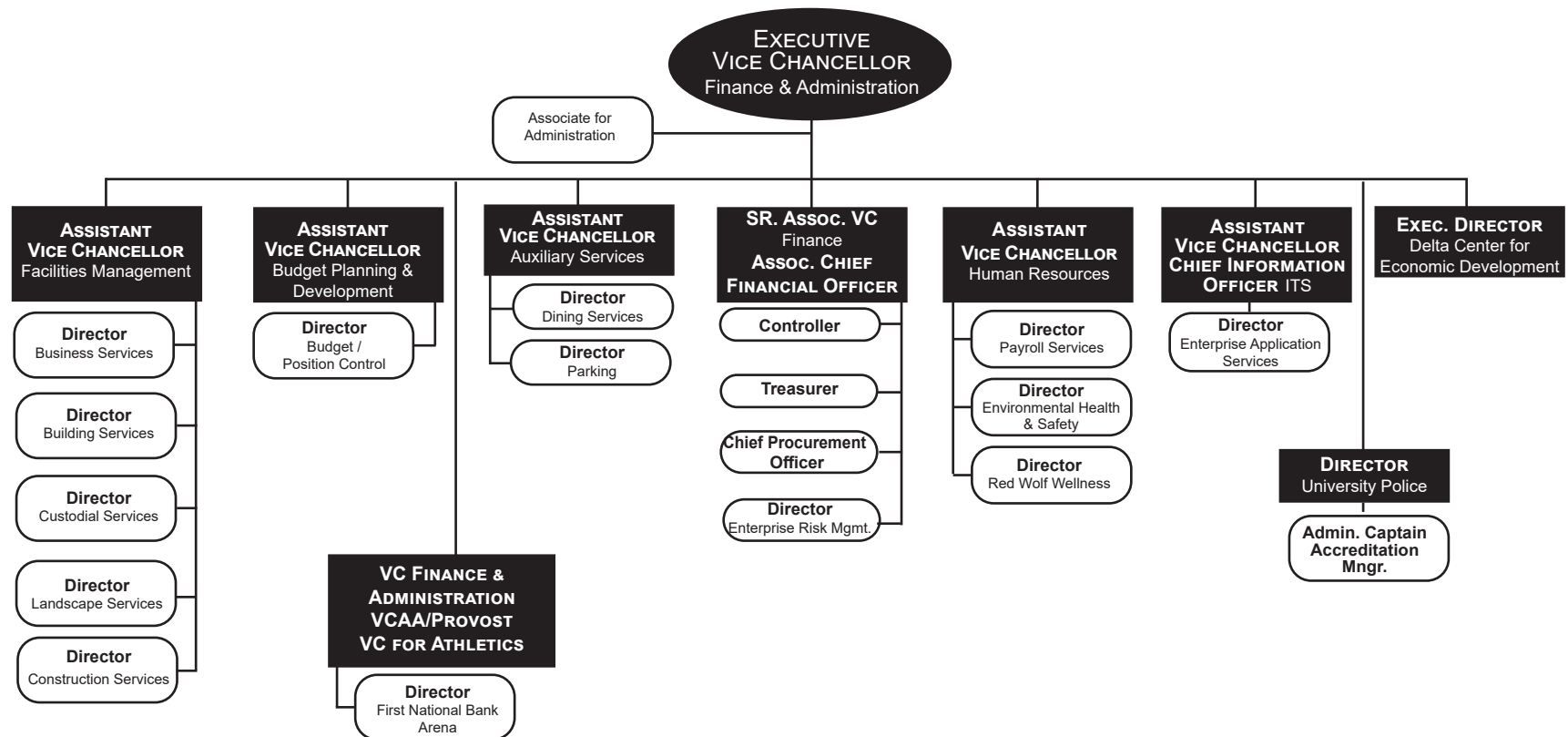
Enrollment Management, A-State

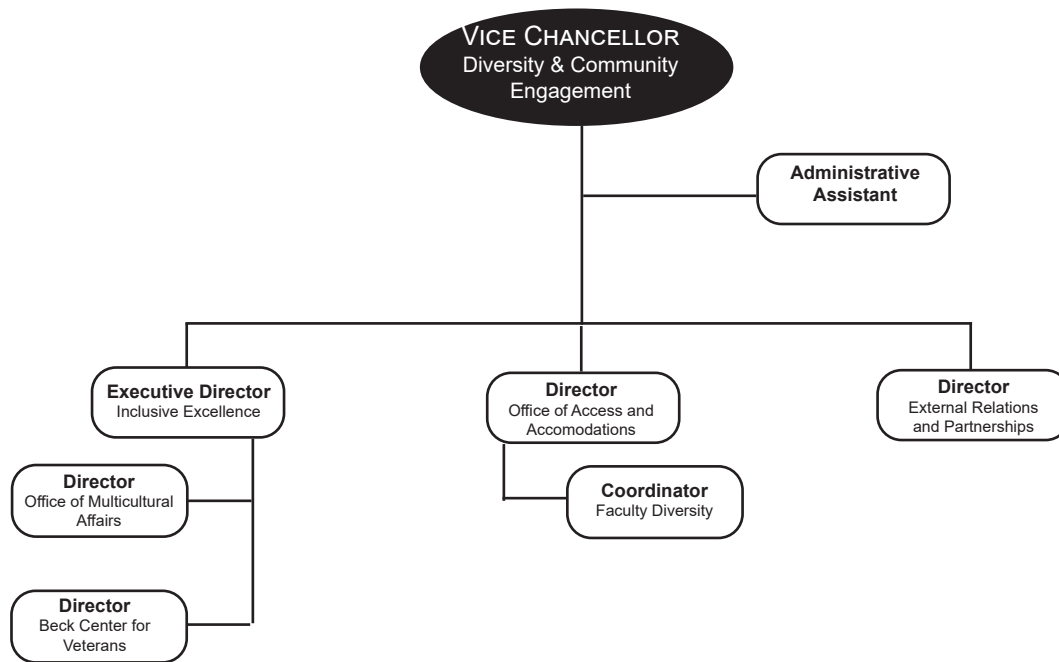

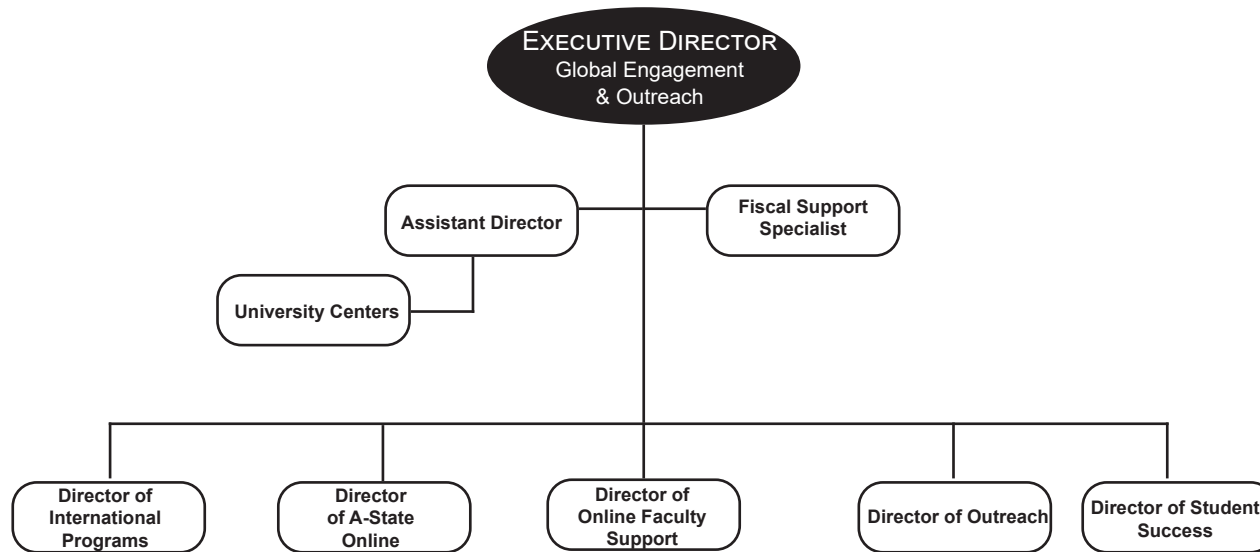

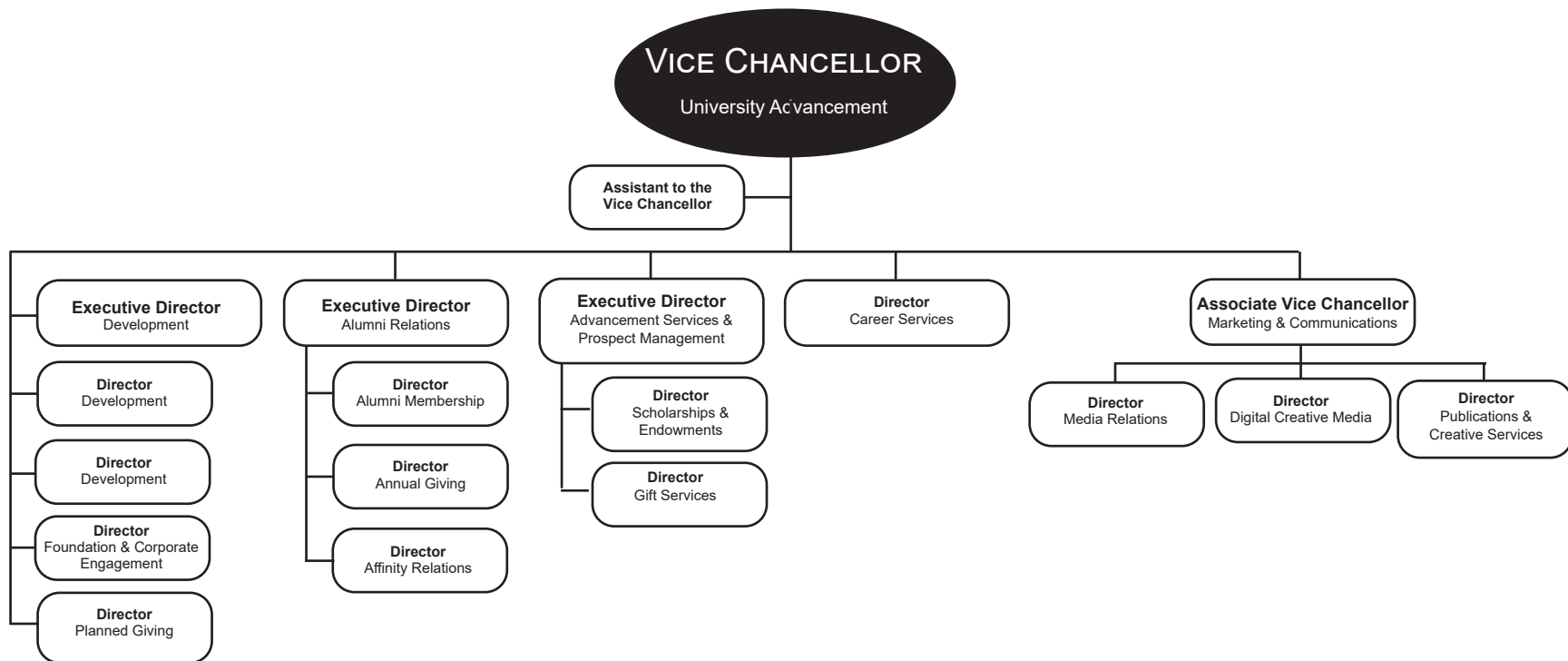

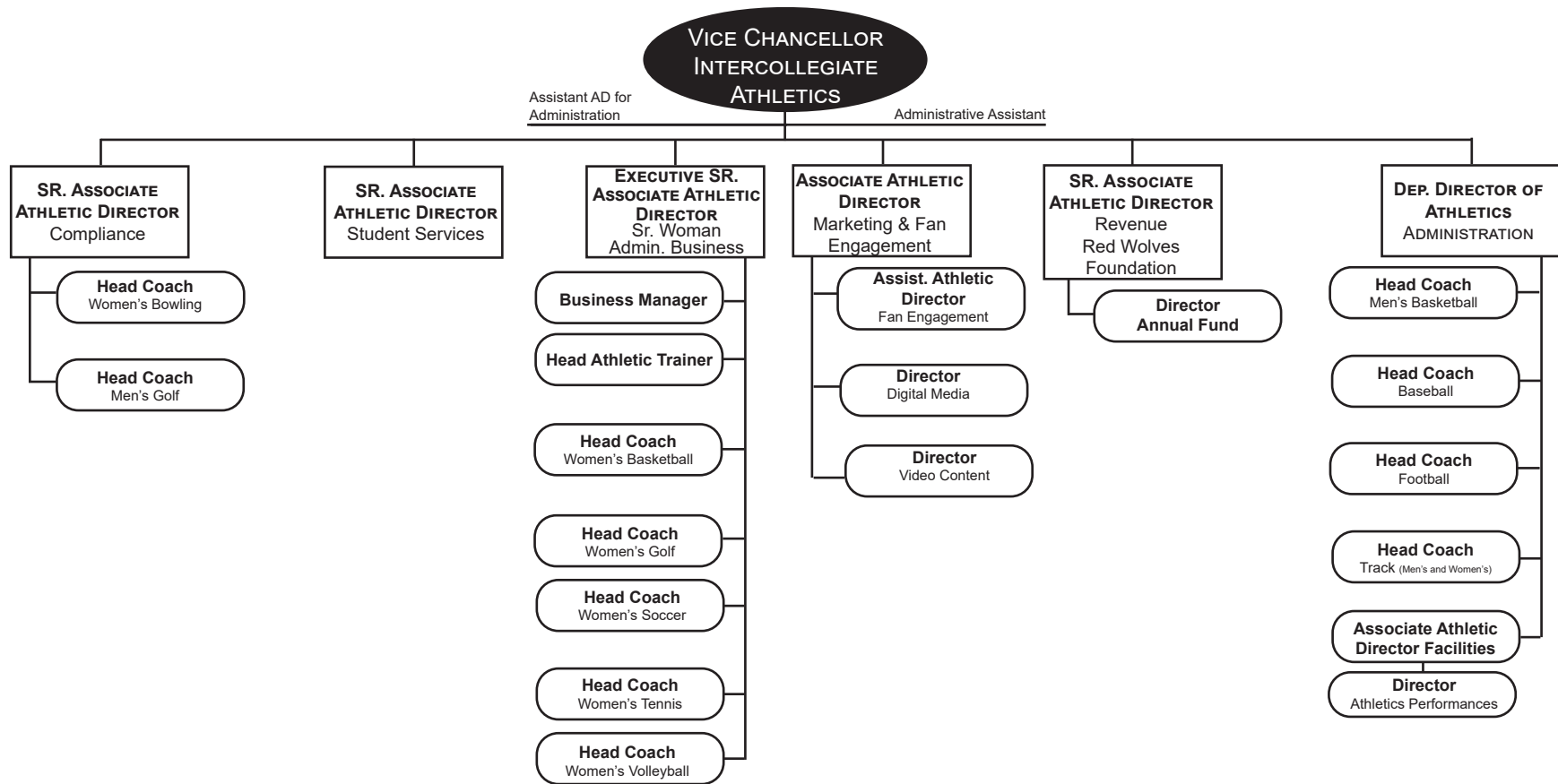
2019-2020 Organizational Structure

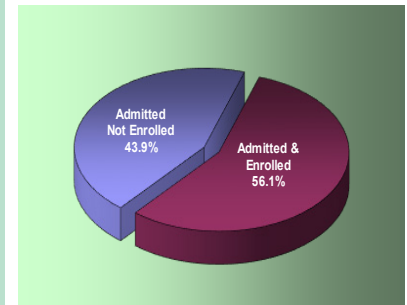

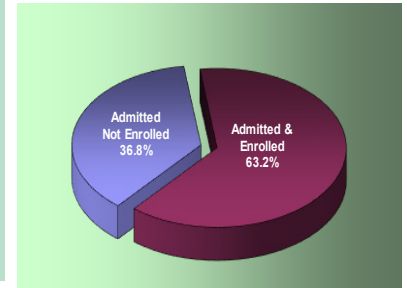
First-Time Admitted Applicants by Enrollment Status

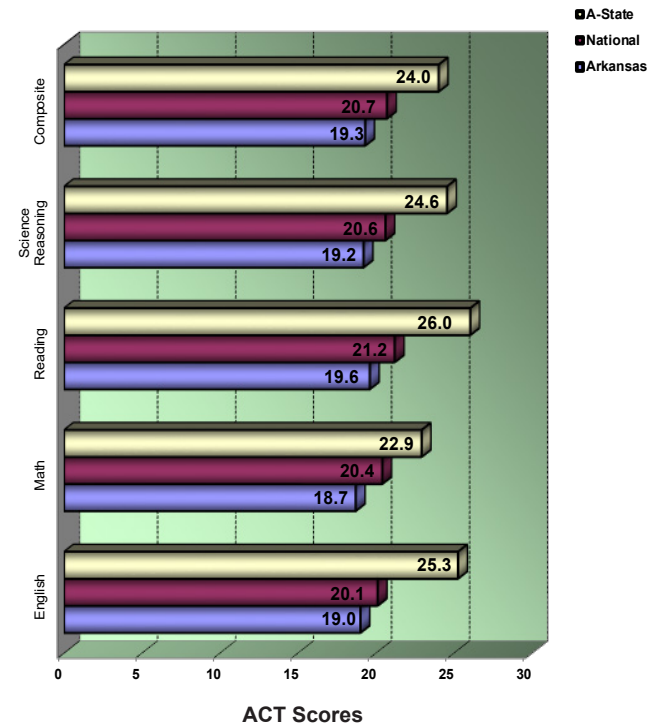

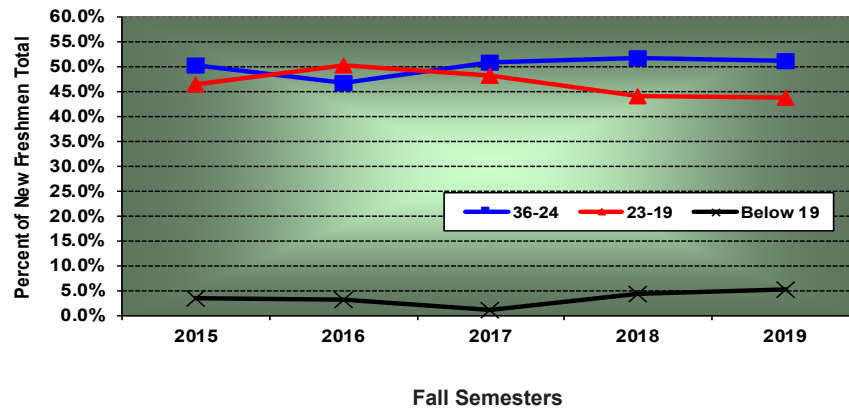

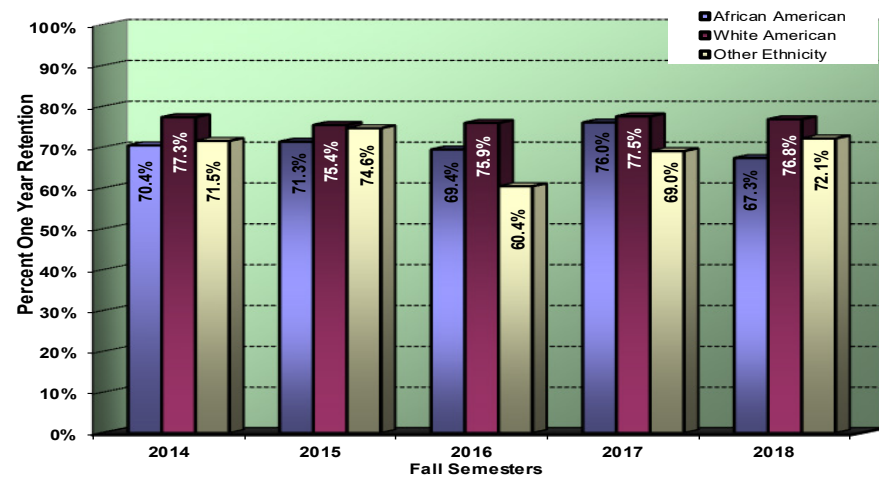

HISTORICAL RETENTION RATES FOR FIRST TIME, FULL-TIME, DEGREE SEEKING STUDENTS BY ETHNICITY



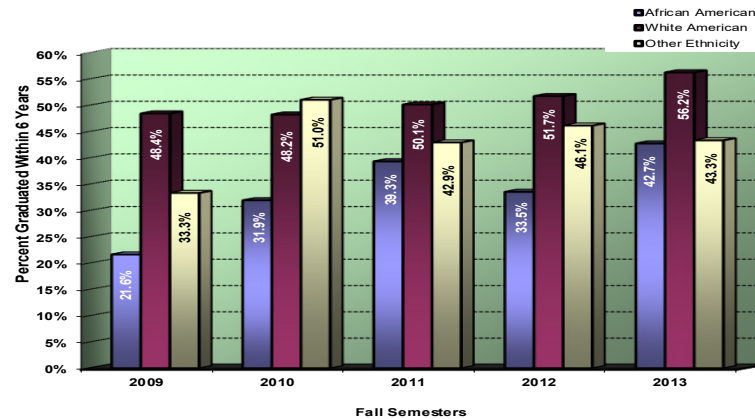

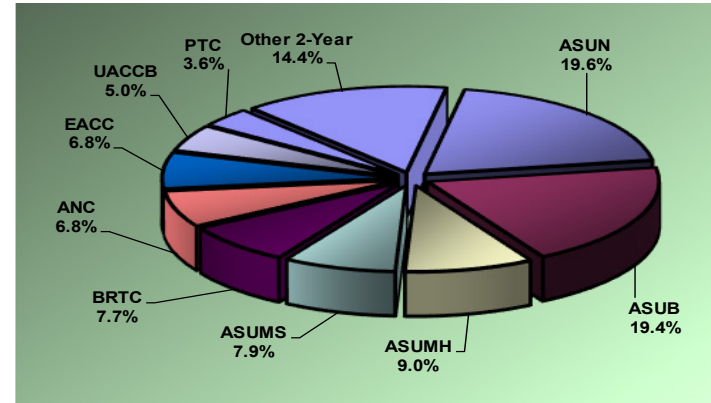

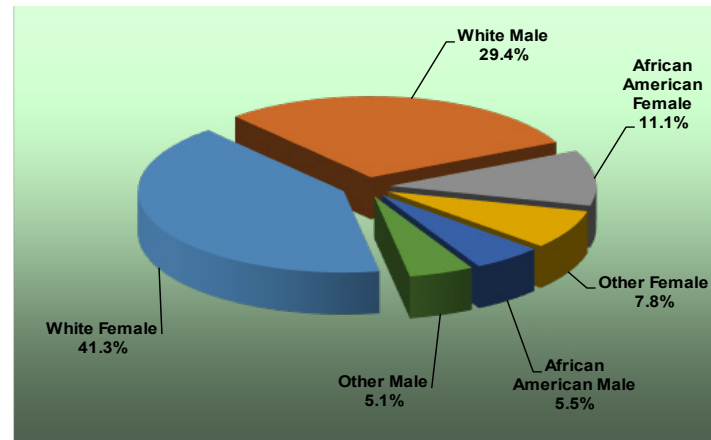

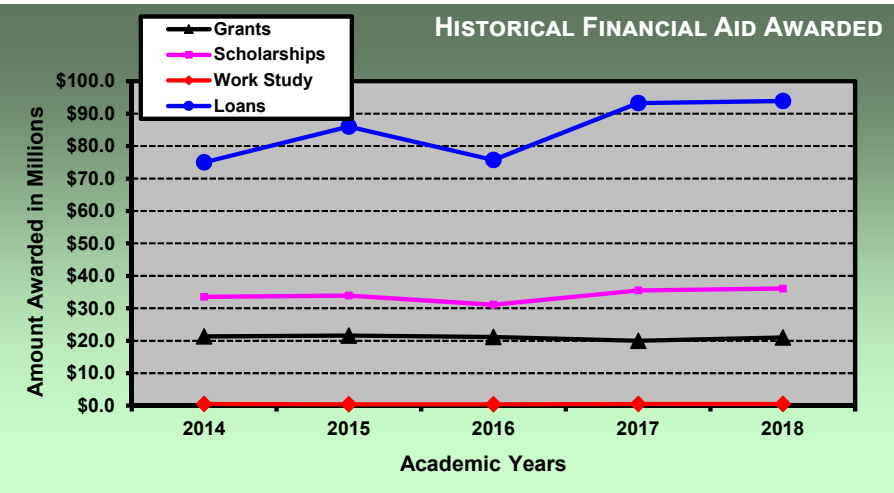

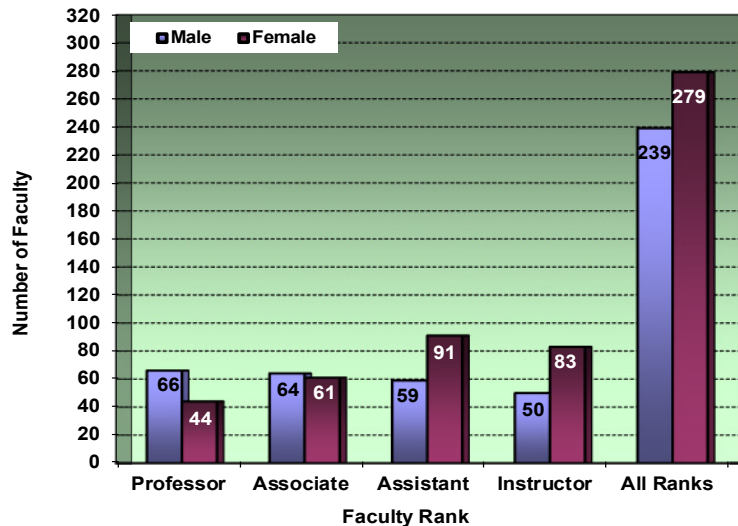

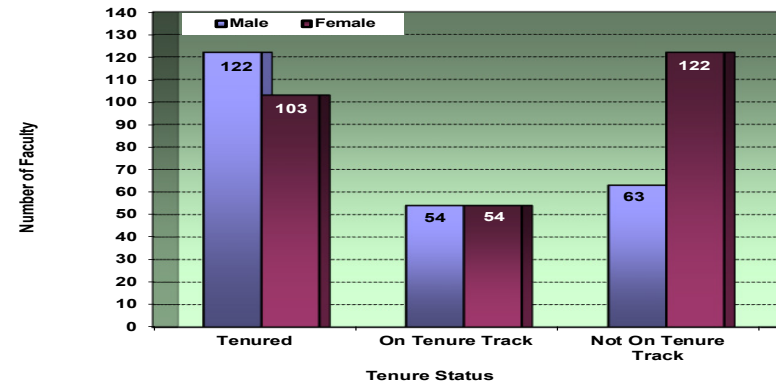
FULL-TIME INSTRUCTIONAL FACULTY BY RANK & GENDER Fall 2019

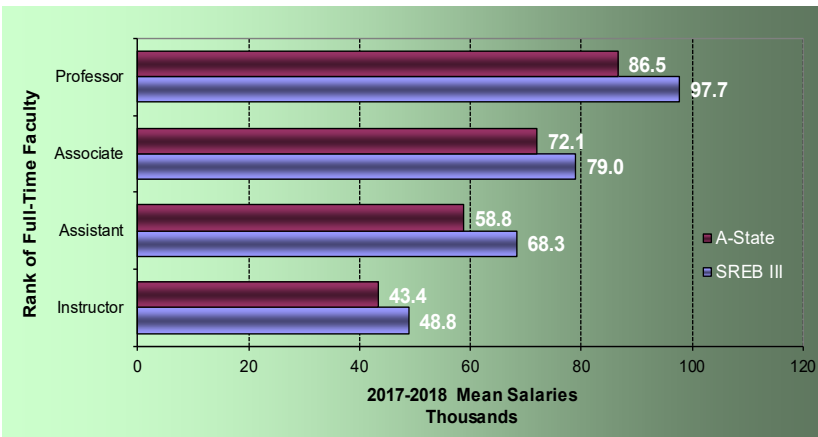

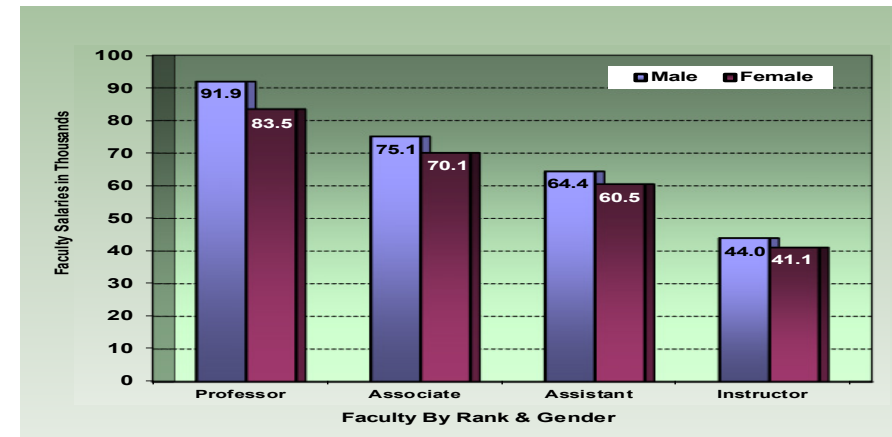
